Facts: Healthcare spending is increasing exponentially and is expected to reach 25% of GDP by 2025. A contributing factor is the overwhelming prevalence of chronic illness in the US, which is projected to increase from \$133 million in 2007 to \$272 million in 2030.

What we can do: The best way to mitigate this problem is by preventing the early onset of disease. Health promotion and disease prevention should be a primary goal of all health care providers, with a specific focus in the Inland Empire, whose patient population has a disproportionate prevalence of these chronic diseases.
